Entries: Online entries open, via your [membership online account](#), on Tuesday 26th August and close at 12 noon on Wednesday 3rd September. Never used this service before? [read this](#). ***Postal or telephone entries not accepted.***

Entries are **non-transferable** and **non-refundable** after the close of entries.

Qualification: It is **recommended** that all competitors have **completed a minimum of one**, AIRC one-day event between the 1st of April and the close of entries for the championships.

A co-efficient will apply in all classes except 6 (Young Horse).

Entrants to class 6 (Young Horse) are open to riders graded RC 90, RC 100, RC 110 and RC 120 for cross-country. Only 4 and 5-year-old horses are eligible for this competition.

Entrants to class 1 is restricted to teams of 3 or 4 riders from an affiliated club with no more than 2 riders from any one grade. Only riders competing in classes 2, 3, 4, and 5 are eligible to represent a club in this championship. Clubs Secretaries may only enter a maximum of 1 team before the close of entries. A rider may only represent their club once in this championship. Mixed club teams are not permitted.

Classes 7 and 8 (Open competitions) are open to competitors of any grade equal to or higher in cross-country.

Entries to class 9 (Combined Training) will compete at their show jumping grade as per rule 6.7 and this class will only run if there are sufficient entries.

Scoring:

Competitors should make themselves aware of the [scoring system that is being used](#) as per last year.

Whereby a grade is split into several sections, the dressage scores will be averaged across all arenas to reflect the likely scores if all riders were in the same arena. This is based on a system used by British Riding Clubs and will allow a champion to be determined in each grade.

Competitors:

Only registered members of the Association of Irish Riding Clubs at the close of entries are eligible to enter this event.

Competitors may only compete at their cross-country grade at the time of entering, irrespective of any subsequent grade changes, except in the combined training class where riders will compete at their show jumping grade.

It is the competitors' responsibility to be fully conversant with the rules for this competition.

Horses:

Horses must be entered under their registered name as described on their passport, at this event. Consult rule 6 in the rules and regulations document (D04/12) for eligibility criteria.



If your horse is not registered with the Association, you will not be able to enter online. For information on registering a horse, [click here](#). Please ensure to register your horse in time before entering this event.

You can check to see if your horse is already registered by logging into your [membership online](#) account or alternatively by searching for it, using its registered name, [here](#).

Entry Fees & Information:

- €70 per individual entry
- €40 per combined training entry
- €30 per team entry

Hors concours and novice horse entries are not accepted at this event. Online entries are subject to an administrative charge which is non-refundable. A supplementary fee of €10 will apply to late entries, if they can be accommodated.

Refunds:

Refunds (excluding the admin charge) will be issued for withdrawals received, in writing using the online [event refund request form \(F14/13\)](#), by the close of entries. No refund will be issued for withdrawals received after this date. Online entries are subject to an administrative charge which is non-refundable.

In the event of this championship being abandoned (i.e. after it started), for whatever reason, no refunds will be issued.

Volunteers:

Each region will be allocated tasks to assist with the running of this event and therefore all participating members will be called upon by your club/region to volunteer at this event.

- Competitors must have their Membership Card in their possession at this event and must present this for inspection when asked as per rule 5.3. You must have the AIRC app installed on your smart device as screenshots are not acceptable.
- Competitors must have their equine passport in their possession at this event. Spot checks will be carried out.

- Competitors must abide by AIRC rules, including dress code, at all times and it is their responsibility to be fully conversant with them for this competition. - Competitors will jump in strict numerical order. Approximate start times for each competition and your jumping order will be posted on www.airc.ie nearer the event.
- BETA 2018 Level 3 body protector & skull caps are mandatory.
- Competitors will have to provide their own number bib for this event and print their own number.
- There will be no farrier service available at this event.
